Course Descriptions.

BNT 215 Romans and Galatians

The basics of Christian education are contained in Paul's Epistle to the Romans. Understanding justification by faith is only one of the ABC's of Christianity you will explore. Paul's letter to the Galatians will provide you with a clear understanding concerning victorious living over sin, the bondage of legalism and the relationship of the new covenant to the old covenant.

PCM 201b Prayer Counseling I (part 2)

This course will "change" your life! Not only will you gain a deeper understanding of who you are (spirit, soul and body) but you will also gain the knowledge of how to bring forth healing in those areas as the Holy Spirit leads you to the cross through prayer. This is a course strongly recommended for ALL - to be better equipped to help others carry their burdens to the cross and to enhance counseling!

BNT 316 7 Messages to the 7 Churches in Revelation

The Body of Christ is confronted with many serious challenges and problems in these last days before Jesus returns. Never has it been more important to understand what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Although these seven messages were first spoken approximately 2,000 years ago, they are just as relevant today as when they were first given to John. It is therefore time to more fully understand what Jesus is saying to His people in this hour - and, especially, what He is saying to you!

TDH 225 Apologetics

Christian apologetics is the defense of the Christian faith. Each Christian should be able to give well thought reasons for why he believes what he does. A Christian's defense of his faith may be about Jesus' actual resurrection, the doctrine of the Trinity or against a cult. This course seeks to give the student formal instructions on many issues that will help him defend the faith he holds so near (see I Peter 5:14). As Christians we must be confident that our beliefs will prevail in the marketplace of ideas.

BOT 208a Book of Psalms II

Do you want to know God more and understand his relationship to his creation, the nations of the world, Israel, and today's believers? Like David and Moses and others who contributed to the Book of Psalms, you can come to know God as the tenderhearted Father, a God who keeps His promises and who lovingly cares for His people. We'll read about those who follow him, their faith and doubts, their victories and failures, and their hopes for the glorious future God has promised. You'll also meet all kinds of people who are faced with a variety of circumstances, crying out to God, praising him, confessing their sins and seeking to worship him in a deeper, more meaningful way. The goal of this course is to build your faith."

PCM 315 Ministerial Services Workshop

As ministers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, we are often called upon to perform duties such as: baptism, dedications, communion, visiting the sick, solemnizing a wedding, and officiating a funeral. This workshop is designed to equip each minister with training on how to effectively minister the Gospel when performing these duties.
